KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



Patrick J. Byrne, USA

Patrick J. Byrne is the Enterprise Chief of Surgical Specialties for Cleveland Clinic. In this role, Dr. Byrne leads Cleveland Clinic's efforts to become a world leader in patient care, outcomes, education, safety, innovation and research across the surgical specialties. He also serves as Chair of Cleveland Clinic's Head and Neck Institute.

Dr. Byrne also serves as the co-Director of the Randolph B Capone Cleft and Palate Program at Greater Baltimore Medical Center. Previously, Dr. Byrne was the Director of the Division of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery in the Department of Otolaryngology/Head and Neck Surgery at The Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland. There, he directed the Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery Fellowship program, as well as co-directed the Johns Hopkins Face Transplant Program. He served as a medical director for Johns Hopkins Medicine International for many years.

Dr. Byrne graduated from the UC San Diego School of Medicine. He completed a surgical internship at the University of California San Francisco and a residency in otolaryngology/head and neck surgery at the UC San Diego School of Medicine. He completed a fellowship in facial plastic and reconstructive surgery at the University of Minnesota Medical School /Children's Minnesota, and a fellowship in Health Care Management at the Advisory Board Company in Washington, DC. Dr. Byrne earned his MBA from The Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania.

Dr. Byrne is an internationally recognized facial plastic and reconstructive surgeon, focusing on microsurgical facial reconstruction, skin cancer management, and facial aesthetic surgery. He has over 130 peer reviewed publications in the field. Dr. Byrne is a world renowned leader in the treatment of facial paralysis, having led and contributed to multiple surgical innovations in this field. He has founded several medical startups and was an early investor/chief medical officer in others. He has a longstanding commitment to service, and leads volunteer teams worldwide, including providing surgical care to children with facial deformities in Nicaragua and many other developing countries.



Joseph Chen, Canada

Dr. Chen holds the rank of Professor at the University of Toronto. He is the Director of the Sunnybrook Cochlear Implant Program as well as the Fellowship Director of Otolaryngology & Skull Base Surgery.

He has served as the Provincial Coordinator of the Ontario Cochlear Implant Program since 2010 and currently directs the Inner Ear Initiative at the Sunnybrook Research Institute, overseeing two research laboratories- Sonja Koerner Regenerative Lab, and the Gord Mason Electrophysiology Lab.

Dr. Chen was the past-Chief of the Department of OTL-HNS, Sunnybrook HSC until 2017. He also served as the University's Post-graduate Director. He received his medical education and residency training at the McGill University in Montreal, and his fellowship training with Professors Ugo Fisch and Joram Raveh of Switzerland.

Dr. Chen's research interests in recent years include quality of life & cost-effectiveness of implantable devices, precision diagnostics and therapeutics in acoustic neuromas.



Marc Cohen, USA

Marc A. Cohen MD, MPH is an Associate Attending on the Head and Neck Service and Surgical Director of the Multidisciplinary Skull Base Tumor Program at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center. He also serves as the Medical Director for Patient Access Programs for Memorial Hospital. Dr. Cohen completed medical school at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine, residency at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, and fellowship at Princess Margaret Cancer Center / University of Toronto. He has clinical interest in open and endoscopic surgery for sinonasal malignancy, robotic surgery for oropharynx cancer, and minimally invasive surgery for head and neck cancers. His research has focused on oncologic and quality of life outcomes for those with skull base malignancy as well as novel technology in sinonasal tumor surgery. He has co-authored more than 115 papers on head and neck cancer and skull base surgery.

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS (CONT'D)



Claire Hopkins, UK

Claire Hopkins is a Consultant Rhinologist at Guy's Hospital, a large tertiary referral centre in London, UK, and a Professor at King's College London. She is the immediate Past-President of the British Rhinological Society, current Academic Chair of ENTUK/BACO, the President of the Royal Society of Medicine's Section of Laryngology and Rhinology, and Secretary General of the European Rhinological Society. She is co-author of the European Position Statement on Rhinosinusitis and Nasal Polyps and the International Consensus on Rhinosinusitis. She has a large research program covering all aspects of medical and surgical management of rhinitis and sinus disease, with a focus on improving outcomes in the management of nasal polyps. She has recently been involved in highlighting the link between COVID-19 and loss of smell and taste, and studying the olfactory outcomes of those affected and the burden of associated disease.



Deepak Mehta, USA

Dr. Mehta attended Mysore University, Karnataka, India, where he earned his medical degree in 1994, followed by a Diploma in Otolaryngology in 1996 from Bangalore University. He then went on to finish his residency training in United Kingdom from South Trent Otolaryngology Program, Nottingham in 2005. He completed a Pediatric Otolaryngology Fellowship at Cincinnati Children's Hospital and Medical Center; Cincinnati, Ohio in 2007. He then joined the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, where he served as Associate Professor and Director of Pediatric Aerodigestive program until 2015. Dr. Mehta joined Texas Children's Hospital in 2015, as Director of the Aerodigestive Center and is appointed Professor in the Department of Otolaryngology at Baylor College of Medicine. He is known for his expertise in Pediatric Otolaryngology specialising in Airway and Swallowing disorders and he has been Invited Speaker in various National and International meetings. As an academician he has published over 100 research articles and is a cofounder of Csurgeries (a web based surgical education site). He has held various leadership positions nationally in the American Academy of Otolaryngology, American Society of Pediatric Otolaryngology and also a former president of Society of Ear Nose and Throat advances in Children (SENTAC).



Julina Ongkasuwan, USA

Dr. Ongkasuwan is a Professor of Otolaryngology Head and Neck Surgery and Chief of Laryngology at Baylor College of Medicine and Texas Children's Hospital in Houston, Texas. After residency at Baylor College of Medicine, she completed fellowships in Pediatric Otolaryngology at Texas Children's Hospital and in Laryngology at the University of California, San Francisco. She treats both adults and children with voice, airway, and swallowing disorders. Her active research interests include laryngeal ultrasound, pediatric dysphagia, and the diagnosis and management of vocal fold paralysis.

Submission Guidelines

1. Authors of research papers who wish to have their abstracts considered for inclusion must submit their abstract electronically via the meeting website having regard to the published closing date. Abstracts submitted after the closing date will not be considered.
2. The title should be brief and explicit.
3. Research papers should follow the format – Aims, Methodology, Results, Conclusion.
4. Excluding title, authors (full given first name and family name) and institution, the abstract must not exceed 2,000 characters and spaces (approximately 300 words). In MS Word, this count can be determined from the 'Review menu'. Any references must be included in this allowance. If you exceed this limit, the excess limit will NOT appear in the meeting publication.
5. Include details of main institution only.
6. Abbreviations should be used only in common terms. For uncommon terms, the abbreviation should be given in brackets after the first full use of the word.
7. Presentations (slide and video) will only have electronic PowerPoint support. Audio visual instructions will be provided to all successful authors.
8. A 50-word CV is required from each presenter to facilitate the Chair's introduction. Excess text will not be captured by the system.
9. The acceptance, timing, presentation and discussion of all papers and posters are at the discretion of the Organising Committee. Notification of the timing of presentations will appear in correspondence sent to all successful authors.
10. Tables, diagrams, graphs etc. CANNOT be accepted in the abstract submission. This is due to the limitations of the computer software program.
11. Please do not type your abstract directly into the submission page. Being internet based, each page on the submission site can only be open for 15 minutes before closing. Type your submission on a text document (eg. MS Word) and copy and paste it into the abstract text field.
12. AUTHORS MUST BE REGISTRANTS OF THE MEETING TO PRESENT AND FOR THEIR ABSTRACT TO APPEAR IN THE PUBLICATIONS.
13. Authors are required to declare conflict of interest if applicable. Failure or refusal to disclose or the inability to resolve the identified conflict will result in the abstract acceptance being withdrawn.
14. Amendments to abstracts after submission are not guaranteed.
15. The submitting author of an abstract will ALWAYS receive an email confirmation of receipt of the abstract into the submission site. If you do not receive a confirmation email within 24 hours, it may mean the abstract has not been received. In this circumstance, please email asohnsasm@surgeons.org to determine why a confirmation email was not received.
16. Authors must comply with the Code of Conduct for the meeting.
